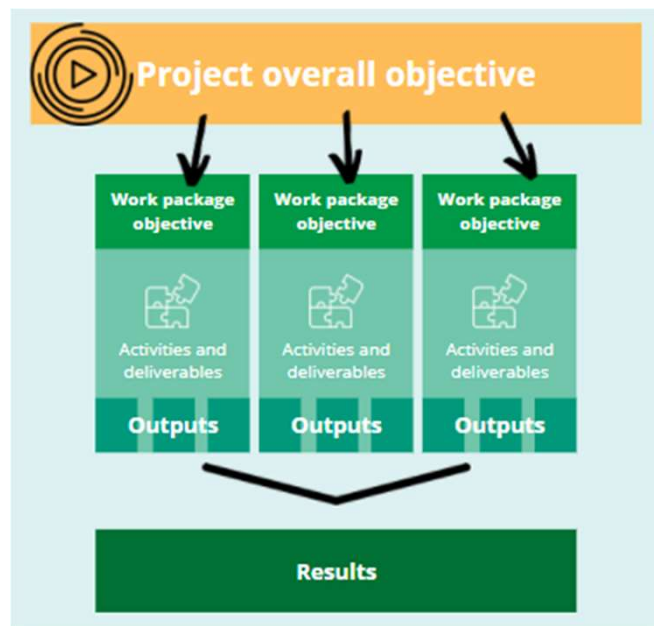

3 Activity 2.3 Pilot site implementation

Interventions (to be defined in WPI and A2.2) consist of a variety of measures like creating sheltered routes and cool spots with vegetation or technical interventions and reducing pavement. Each pilot will test several aspects (effects in the city, such as on temperature (PET), other environmental effects, maintenance, financial and planning effects, practical possibilities of combining the Cool Network with other urban challenges) in different situations, which will be coordinated by AUAS.

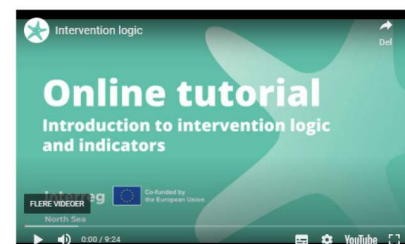

CORE MESSAGE

The intervention logic is the programme's main tool to structure the individual projects. Indicators form part of the intervention logic and applicants will have to set targets for indicators in the application form. The achievements on indicators will contribute to the project's objectives, which also form part of the intervention logic and are also set at application stage. Projects must monitor their achievements on indicators and objectives through progress reports.
