Neighborhood hubs Amsterdam

- 14 eHub locations in Amsterdam
 - System on its own -> no connection with city wide shared mobility system
 - Upscaling > More shared mobility in the hubs
 - 7 eHubs will be relocated because of the expant

20 new neighborhood:

- Public transport locations
- Areas with high demands for public space / parking complaints SM / narrow sidewalks
- Outskirt areas with a low numbers of freefloating shared mobility (policy goal)
- Areas where parking regulations are introduced
- Indoor facilities / (car/bike) parkings
- Data from SM operators (open app requests for SM)
- Areas with crowded parking facilities


Bottum up approach:

- Short term upscaling plan neighborhoodhubs




■ Top down:

Neighborhoodhub


- Small hub in public space
- Always within 5 minutes walk

Districthub

- Central location in district
- More functions come together



How to create a network?



Cityhubs


- Convergence of transport modes on (inter)urban nodes
- Mostly at trainstations

Regional hubs

- Transition of urban and regional transport network
- Central role for parking


